



Ginger is hiring 100 environmental and construction engineers and technicians

PARIS, 26 July 2017 – To meet its very strong business growth, Groupe Ginger plans to create around a hundred new jobs by end 2017 throughout France. This recruitment drive involves all positions of the Group's business: engineers, technicians, support roles, management positions, overseas assignments, etc.

Two activity poles are involved: construction, via its Ginger CEBTP subsidiary and environment, via its BURGEAP subsidiary.
